Book Notes: When the Pilgrims arrived at the new land, they had many trials and tribulations to overcome. One of which was dealing with the Indians. In the spring of 1610, in what many consider the "first American Thanksgiving," colonists in Jamestown, Virginia, held a thanksgiving prayer service after English supply ships arrived with much-needed food. Images of the landing at Plymouth in 1620, meetings with the Native people and the first Thanksgiving are included to help students consider the artistic vision in contrast to the reality of the actual events. Students can compare historical Thanksgiving celebrations with the ways families, schoolchildren and communities observe Thanksgiving
